**For planning purposes, \$150/Hr for log truck hauling costs are used. This is a generous estimate based on local hauling costs. If actual bids come in lower, additional log loads can be transported.*

*** Four chords of firewood can supply a family with heat for an entire winter.*

Southwest Conservation Corp Ancestral Lands Program-

This program recruits, trains, deploys, and provides education stipends to youth conservation crews. The Ancestral Lands program specifically hires Native youth in the communities where the projects are occurring. If hired, these crews can provide trained chainsaw operators to help buck and process the logs into firewood. The Southwest Conservation Corp Ancestral Lands Program has offices in Gallup and Kykotsmovi.
